Fines for Convicted Traffickers, Pimps, and Sex Buyers

Under Act 105 (2014), Act 130 (2018), and the Crimes Code

Law	Section	Fine
Act 105	Section 3011 – Trafficking in Individuals	F1: up to \$25,000 F2: up to \$25,000 (not codified in statute)
Act 105	Section 3012 – Involuntary Servitude	F1: up to \$25,000 (not codified in statute)
Act 105	Section 3013 – Patronizing a Victim of Sexual Servitude	Mandatory \$500
Act 105	Section 3017 – Violation by Business Entities	Not more than \$1,000,000
Crimes Code	Section 5902(b) – Promoting Prostitution	F3: up to \$15,000 M2: up to \$5,000 (not codified in statute)
Crimes Code	Section 5902(b.1) – Promoting Prostitution of a Minor	F3: up to \$15,000 (not codified in statute)
Crimes Code	Section 5902(e) – Patronizing Prostitutes	M1: up to \$10,000 M2: up to \$5,000 M3: up to \$2,000 (not codified in statute)
Act 130	Section 3011, 3012, 3013, 5902(b), 5902(b.1)	Additional \$5,000
Act 130	Section 5902(e) – adult victim	Additional \$2,5000
Act 130	Section 5902(e) – when defendant knew or should have known victim was a minor	Additional \$5,000

Note. Per Act 130 § 3064(b) Fines. – Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the fines provided by this subsection **shall be in addition to** any fine authorized or required by law (emphasis added).
